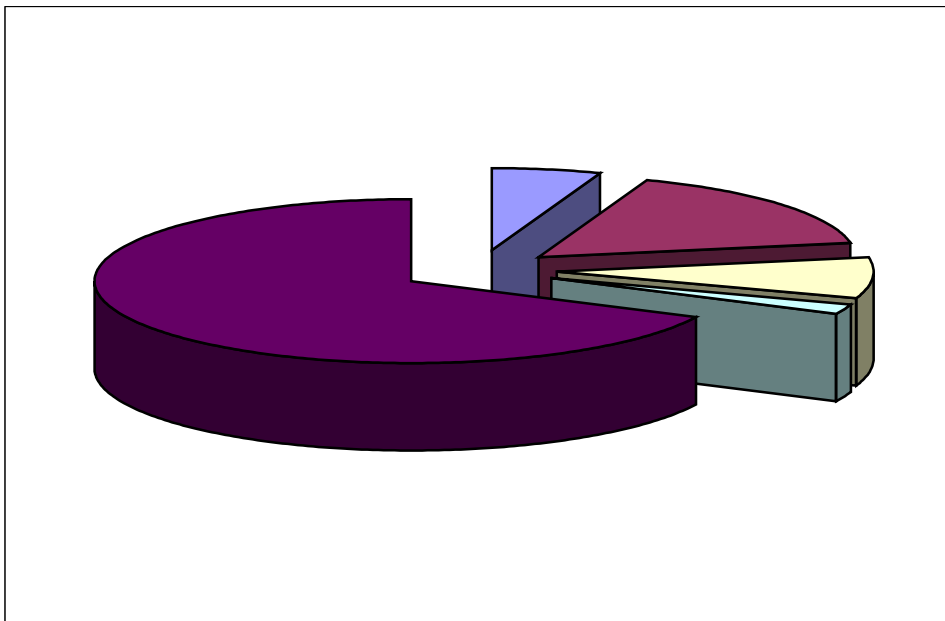

# **CHAPTER – I**

## **FRAME WORK FOR DATA COLLECTION**

### **1.1 Introduction**

National Employment Service in the country functions through a network of employment exchanges located in various parts of the country. The services rendered by the employment exchanges includes registration & placement, vocational guidance and career counseling and collection of Labour Market Information etc. National employment Service covers all the States and Union Territories with a network of 947 employment exchanges as on 31-12-2005. Administrative control of Employment Exchanges lies with the respective State/U.T governments. As part of their administrative functioning, Employment Exchanges collect data on various aspects of employment and unemployment and submit it to the respective State Directors of Employment and to the Directorate General of Employment and Training (D.G.E&T). While the State Governments compile this data at the State level, D.G.E&T. compiles and releases this data at all India level.

Employment Directorate in the DGE&T is responsible for laying down the policies, standards, norms and guidelines for coordination of the National Employment Service At All India level. In addition, it also evaluates and monitors employment and unemployment situation at all India level using various sources of employment data such as Census, Labour Force Surveys conducted by National Sample Survey Organisation, Employment Market Information Programme etc. In this publication, data on jobseekers registered with the employment exchanges is analysed to evaluate incidence of unemployment in the country.

### **1.2 Reference Period**

Employment Exchanges collect data in the form of 13 returns known, as Employment Exchanges Statistics Returns with each return covering a specific field of activity like registration, placement etc. with different periodicity. There are 6 annual, 5 half-yearly, 1 quarterly and 1 monthly return as details below.

### **1.3 Concepts and Definitions**

For the sake of clarity, some of the important terms, relevant to the administrative records generated in the employment exchanges, are explained below.

Applicant: - A person who voluntarily registers at an Employment Exchange, and is eligible for employment and other assistance in accordance with the prescribed procedure.

Apprentice: - A person who is undergoing apprenticeship training in a trade in pursuance of a contract of apprenticeship.

Apprentices Act: - The Apprentices Act, 1961, which provides for the regulation and control of training of apprentices in trades and matters connected therewith.

Dead Register: - Systematic arrangement of Index Cards of applicants who for various reasons are not entitled to placement assistance.

Displaced Person: - A person who, on account of the setting up of India and Pakistan or on account of civil disturbances or fear of such disturbances in any area which formed part of the erstwhile Pakistan had been displaced from or left his place of residence in such an area after 1st day of March, 1947, and who has subsequently been residing in India (Government of India Ordinance No. XX of 1948). Where, however, State Government has evolved a system of registration of Displaced Persons only those persons who are in possession of evidence if such registration should be regarded as "Displaced Persons" by Employment Exchanges for purposes of employment under that State.

Educated: - A job seeker who is having qualification of the level of 10<sup>th</sup> standard and above.

Group Discussion: - A discussion with a homogenous group of applicants or students involving detailed information on job opportunities, training facilities and such other matters pertaining to career planning or choosing appropriate career to the group.

Group Guidance: - All group activities conducted for guidance purposes.

Handicapped Person: - A person who on account of injury, disease or congenital deformity is substantially handicapped in obtaining or keeping employment or in undertaking work on his own account of a kind which apart from the injury, disease or deformity would be suited to his age, experience and qualifications.

Lapsed Registration: - A registration that is declared null and void because it fails to meet relevant procedural requirements such as renewal, response to two consequent call letters etc.

Live Register: - Systematic arrangement of Index Cards pertaining to applicants who are in need of employment assistance.

Multiple Registration: - Registration of an applicant at more than one Exchange at the same point of time.

Placement: - An employer's acceptance of a person into a remunerative job through the Employment Exchange. This includes: acceptance by employers of applicants submitted by Exchanges for training/apprenticeship with the object of their becoming paid employee on completion of their training/apprenticeship.

Registration: - The process of recording the particulars of an employment seeker according to prescribed procedure with a view to render him employment assistance.

Registration Guidance: - Brief counseling given to an applicant at the time of registration.

Renewal of Registration: - The process of extension of the period for which registration is valid for purposes of rendering employment assistance.

Submission: - Forwarding of applicant's particulars to an employer for consideration against a notified, advertised or speculative vacancy.

Vocational Guidance: - Assistance given to an individual in solving problems related to vocational planning and to occupational choice and profession with due regard for the individual characteristics and their relation to occupational opportunities.

#### **1.4 Limitations of Data**

Data flowing from the Employment Exchanges suffer from some limitations. These limitations arise out of the fact that the Employment Exchanges are mostly located in urban areas. The job seekers from the rural areas may find it difficult to register their names with the Employment Exchanges. Further, the registration of applicants with the Employment Exchanges is voluntary in nature. As such, the following limitations of the data may be kept in view while using the publication: -

- All the job seekers registered with the employment exchanges are not necessarily unemployed.
- All the job seekers or unemployed do not necessarily register themselves with the Employment Exchanges.
- In some exceptional cases there is a chance of duplication of registration.
- The job-seekers, when find employment through agencies other than Employment Exchanges do not intimate the Employment Exchanges for deletion of their names from the live register.
- Employers do not always intimate the Employment Exchanges about the selection of candidates even when selection is done from the list supplied by Employment Exchanges.
- There can be cases when job seekers could not renew their card within the stipulated period and by virtue of their non-renewal, their names get deleted from the live register.

Another important aspect is the fact that a number of registrants do have some employment or the other, but have registered for better jobs particularly in the Public Sector. A survey on the activity status of job seeker registered with the Employment Exchanges was carried out and report was published in 1990. On the basis of the survey, it was revealed that as per 'Usual Status' classification, 32.2% of the job seekers were employed, 55.8% unemployed and 11.8% pursuing further studies.

## CHAPTER II

### EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE STATISTICS: AN ANALYSIS

In this chapter, Employment Exchange Statistics pertaining to the year ended December 2005 are presented. The number of job seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges in the country has been classified according to various variables such as age, gender, education level etc. and analyzed with a view to understand the labour market composition.

#### 2.1 LIVE REGISTER

Live Register consists of systematic arrangement of Index Cards pertaining to applicants who are in need of employment assistance and who are registered with the Employment Exchanges. Live Register, therefore, provides the total number of persons waiting for job as on a particular day. The number of job seeker on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges is often taken as an indicator of the level of unemployment in the country.

The data on year-wise total number of job-seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges, placement effected against the vacancies notified, along with the number of job-seekers waiting for the job at end of the year (Live Register) for the period 1996-2005 are indicated in Table-1. The salient features of the trends observed in Table No. 1 are given as under:

- As on 31st December 2005, around 3.93 crore persons were waiting for jobs as compared to 4.05 crore as on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2004.
- On an average, around 50-55 lakh job seekers are registering with the employment exchanges per year during the last few years.
- The total number of vacancies notified during each of the years between 1996 to 2005 varied between 2.2 to 4.2 lakh. The highest (4.2 lakh) was in 1996 and lowest (i.e. 2.2 lakh) was in 2002. An increasing trend has been noticed in the number of vacancies notified to the employment exchanges during the last 3 years (2003-05).
- No. of vacancies notified has gone up from 2.7 lakh in 2004 to 3.5 lakh in 2005.

- The placement, which was of the order of 1.38 lakh in the year 2004, has gone up to 1.73 lakh in the year 2005.
- Out of the total number of vacancies notified during 2005, around 50% were filled through the employment exchanges.
- Placement to submission ratio was around 7.3% at the All India level during 2005.

### **Live Register (Category-wise)**

- The numbers of women job seekers have increased from 99.3 lakh in 1999 to 106.1 lakh in 2004.
- The percentage of women job seekers to the total job-seekers has increased from 24.6% in 1999 to 26.2% in 2004.

- Similar trend is observed for the Live Register of SC/ST also. The Live Register of SC has increased from 59.0 lakh to 64.7 lakh and for ST it increased from 17.6 lakh in 1999 to 22.2 lakh in 2004.
- The Live Register of physically handicapped persons has increased from 4.6 lakh in 1999 to 5.7 lakh in 2004.
- The percentage of live register of physically handicapped to total live register is at the level of around 1.4% in 2004.

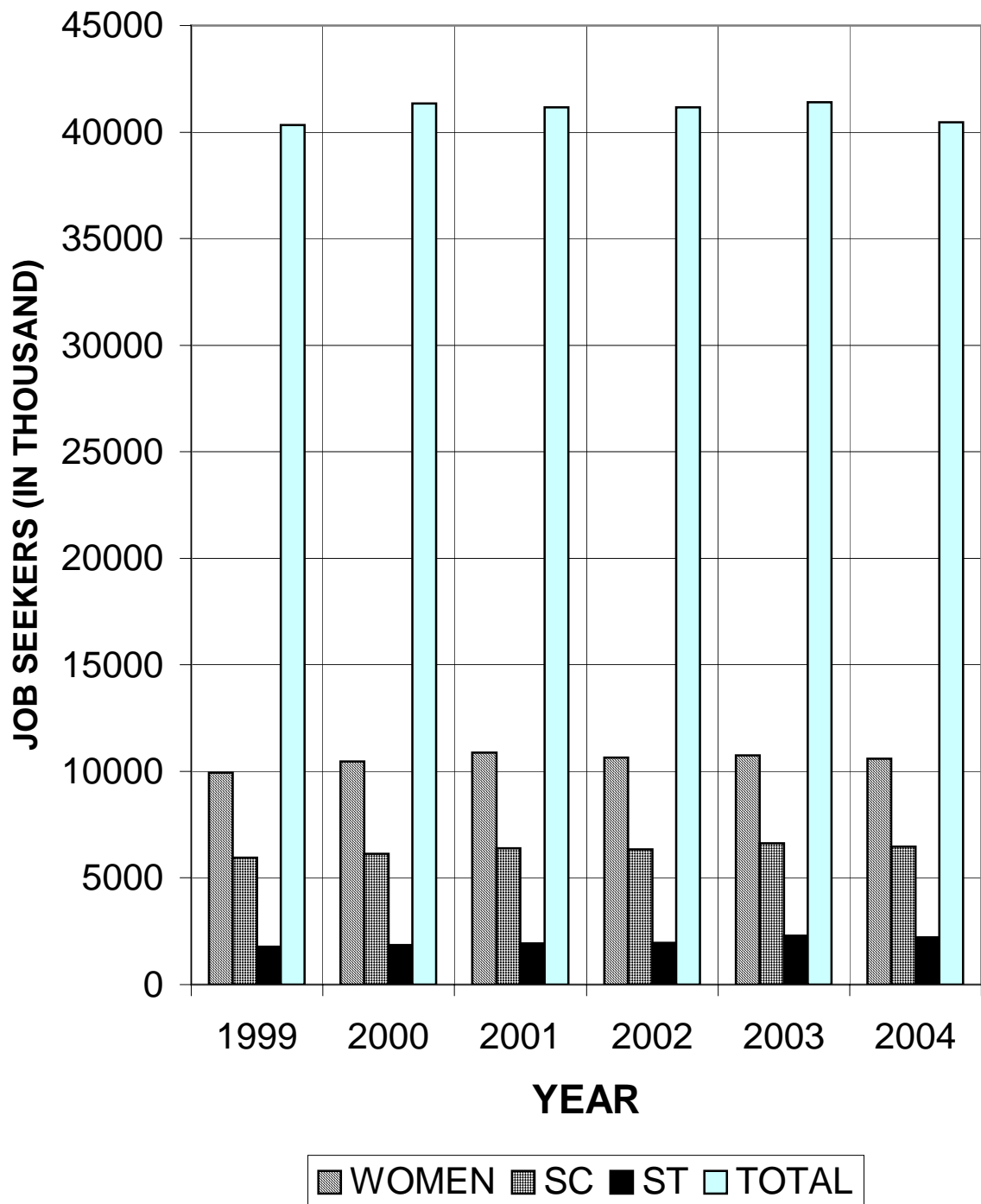

### **Live Register (State-wise)**

The State-wise distribution of Job seekers registered with Employment Exchanges for the year 2005 is indicated in Table-2. From the table it is observed that

- Maximum number of employment exchanges are in Kerala (86) followed by UP(84) & W.B.(75).
- The maximum number of job-seeker were in West Bengal (72.9 lakh) followed by Maharashtra (39.9), Tamil Nadu (36.8 lakh), and Kerala (36.3 lakh).
- The number of vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges during the year 2005 were maximum in Gujarat (121.5 thousand) followed by Tamil Nadu (37.9 thousand). Maharashtra (36.8 thousand), and Manipur (24.0 thousands). In other States, the vacancies notified varied between 0.1 thousand to 20.6 thousand.
- The names of as many as 24.0 lakh job seekers were sponsored by the Employment Exchanges and out of these only 1.8 lakh could find the placement which is far less than the vacancies notified (3.5 lakh) during the year 2005.
- Registration during the year 2005 is maximum in Tamil Nadu (6.9 Lakh) followed by Maharashtra (6.8 Lakh).
- Placement during the year 2005 was maximum in Gujarat (93 thousand).
- Placement to submission ratio was maximum in Haryana (28.5) followed by Gujarat (23.4%), Chhattisgarh (17.6%), and Rajasthan (12.5%).

## 2.2 Age-wise Distribution of the Job seekers

Age-wise distribution of the job seeker on the Live Register of the Employment Exchanges for the year 2000-2004 and its State-wise distribution for the year 2004 are given in Table-3 and Table-4 respectively. The age distribution for different years indicates the following: -

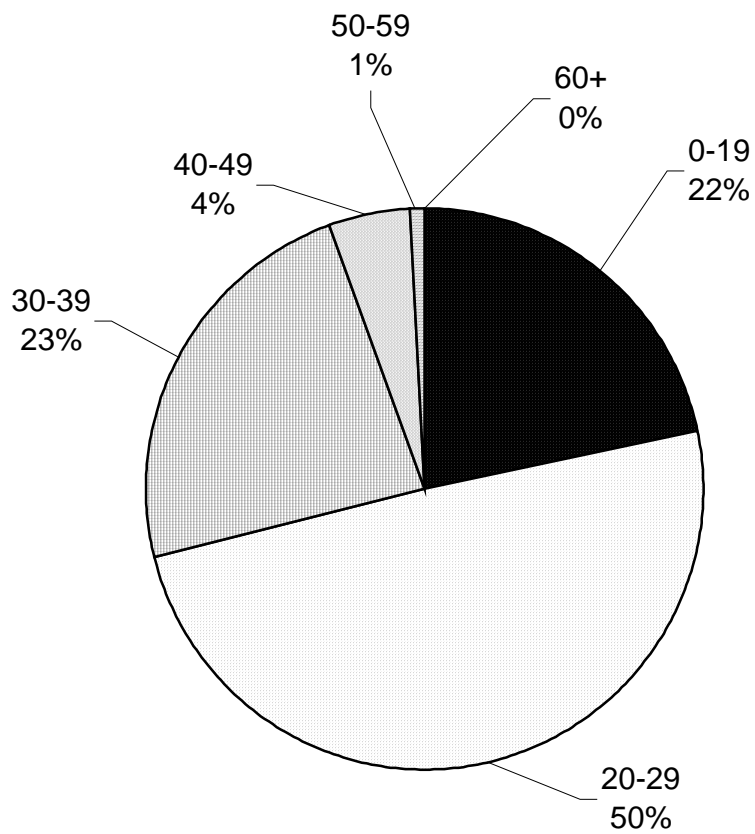
- Approximately 71 % of the jobseekers are below the age of 29 years.
- Aged persons i.e. of age 60 years and above were on the Live Register and their number in the year 2004 was 32.3 thousand.
- The number of job seeker in the age group of 20 to 39 years, which was approx. 73.3% of the total number of job seeker in the year 2000, has gone down to 72.6% of the total number of job seekers in the year 2004.
- The number of job seekers in the age group of 30 years & above, had gone down during the period 2004 as compared to 2003. The percentage of job-seeker in the age group of 30 and above to the total number of job-seekers which was of the order of 28.6% in 2003 has gone up to 28.9% in 2004.

When we look at the State-wise details for the year 2004 we observe the following: -

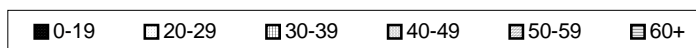
- 59.7 thousand persons with age 50-59 years were registered in West Bengal followed by 55.0 thousand in Kerala, 49.0 thousand in Tamil Nadu at the end of 2004.
- Around 32.3 thousand jobseekers in the age group 60 year & above still continue to be on the Live Register. A majority of them being in West Bengal.

### 2.3 EDUCATED JOB-SEEKERS (10<sup>th</sup> standard above)

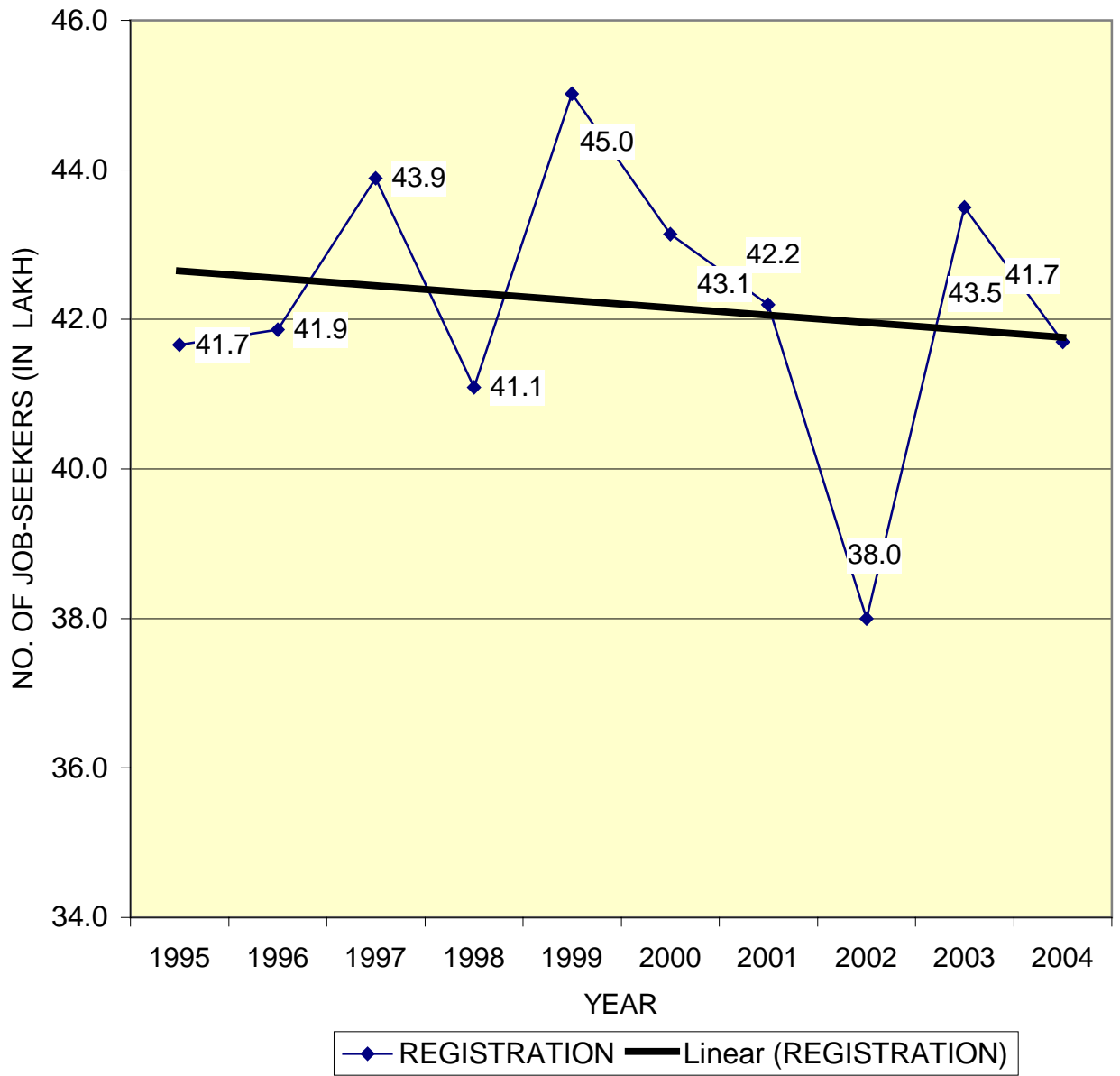
The major share of job-seekers awaiting jobs in the Employment Exchanges was that of educated persons. Year-wise details of the educated job-seekers are given in Table-5.

- Around 42 lakh educated jobseekers are registering with the employment exchanges in a year.
- The percentage of educated job-seekers to the total job-seekers has increased from 67.5% at the end of 1995 to 72.3% at the end of 2004. This is indicative of the fact that over the years educational profile of jobseekers is continuously improving.
- While educated Live Register is around 72% of the total Live Register, educated Placement are around 43.0% of total placements.
- A graphical presentation of year wise registration of educated job-seekers for the period 1995-2004 is given on page No. 13.

Table-6 shows the number of educated job-seekers according to their levels of education. It is clear that

- the maximum number of job-seekers (164.4 lakh i.e. 56.2%) were of the level educated upto the level of X Pass
- Higher Secondary and Under Graduate or XII pass accounts for 75.7 lakh (25.9%) and Graduate and above were 52.5 lakh (17.9%).
- Among the Graduates and above level of job-seekers, maximum (21.2 lakh, 40.5% of total Graduates) was from Arts discipline. Science and Science related subjects job-seekers were comparatively less.

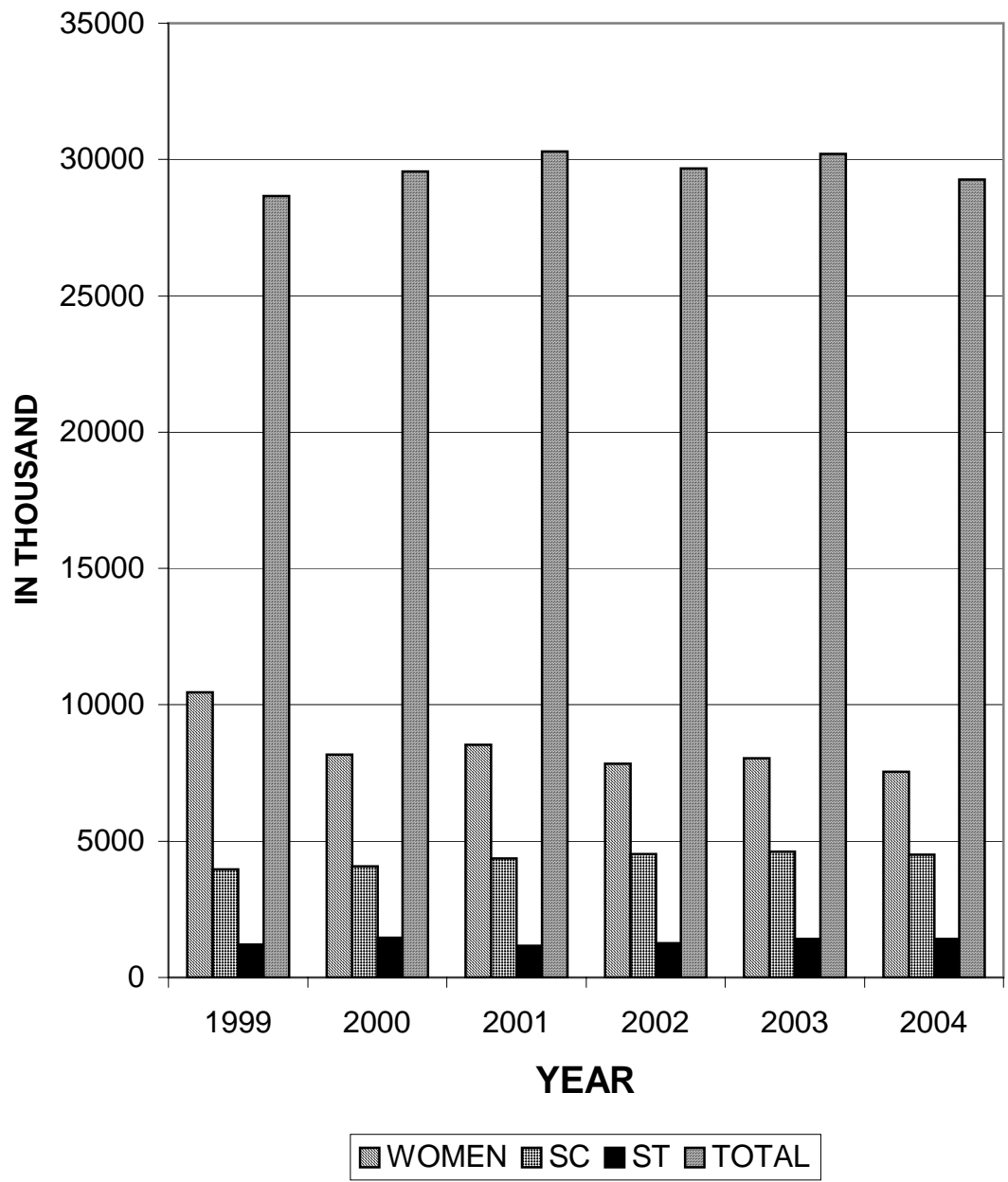

It may be seen from the above statement that

- educated women at the end of 2004 accounted for 25.8% of the total educated job-seekers.
- Educated SC/ST job-seeker have also registered an increase over the years. Educated SC job seekers have increased from 40.8 lakh (14.0% of the total educated) in 2000 to 45.1 lakh (15.4% of total educated) in 2004.
- Educated ST job seekers have increased from 11.4 lakh (3.9% of total educated) in 2000 to 14.1 lakh (4.8% of total educated) in 2004.

A graphical representation of category-wise-educated job seekers is given on the page no. 15.

## CATEGORY-WISE LIVE REGISTER OF EDUCATED JOB-SEEKERS



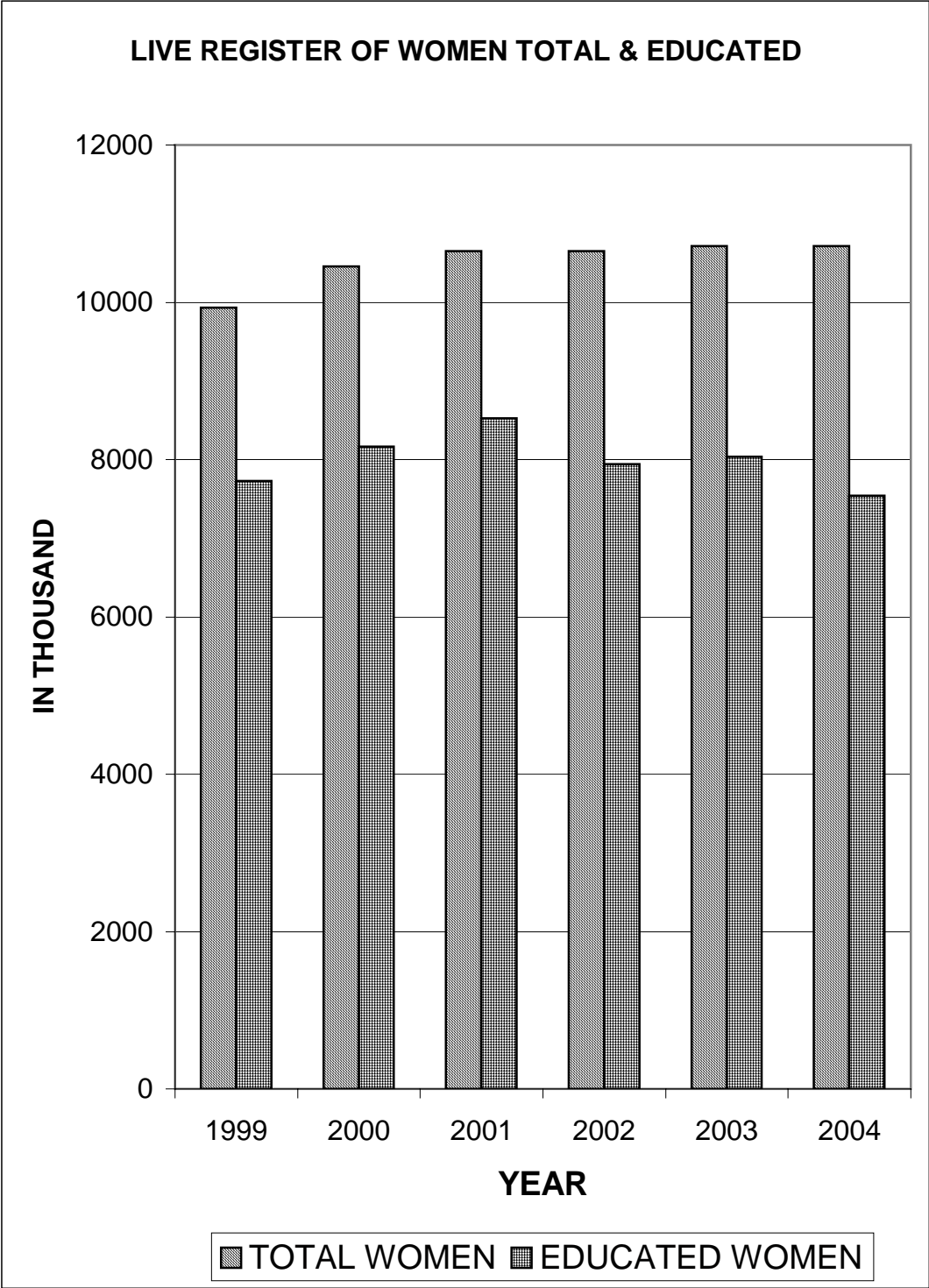
## 2.4. WOMEN JOB-SEEKERS

The number of women seeking jobs through employment exchange has increased over the years. Table-7 gives the number of women job seekers for the period 1996-2005.

- Women constitute around 27.0% of the total Live Register.
- Live Register of women job seekers has shown an increase of 26.6% during 1996 to 2005. However, as compared to the last year, Live Register of Women during 2005 has marginally gone down.
- The placement of women effected through the employment exchanges has been increasing over the years. It was around 32.4 thousand during the year 2005 as compared to 24.5 thousand during 2004.
- The percentage of placements to registration has declined. It has come down from 3.5% in 1996 to 2.0% in 2005.

Table-8 gives the position of women job-seekers in different States at the end of the year 2005.

- Among the major states Kerala has the maximum (21.1 lakh) women job-seekers followed by West Bengal (19.3 lakh) and Tamil Nadu (15.3 lakh)
- Among the major States minimum number of women job-seekers are in Rajasthan (1.0 lakh).
- Placement of women job-seekers was maximum (9.6 thousand) in Gujarat.
- The percentage of educated women job seekers among the total women job seekers has decreased from 73.3% in 1995 to 70.4% in 2004.
- Live Register for women (educated and total) has registered a decline during 2004 as compared to 2003.
- Placement of educated women has also gone down during 2004 (15.8 thousand) as compared to 2003 (22.0 thousand).



- Among the graduate and above women job seekers the highest (6.6 lakh) were in the field of Arts followed by Education and Science with 3.7 lakh and 2.9 lakh respectively.
- Placements of educated women were not found better than the overall placement of women. Among the 24.5 thousand women placed during 2004, 15.8 were educated.
- The live register of educated women has increased from 58.8 lakh in 1995 to 75.4 lakh in 2004.

A graphical representation of Live Register of Total and Educated Women is given on the page no. 17.

## **2.5 SCHEDULED CASTES/SCHEDULED TRIBES/OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES JOB SEEKERS**

The employment service, as in the past, continued making efforts to cater to the special needs of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe job-seekers. Over the years, a number of special measures were adopted by the Employment Exchanges to safeguard the interest of the job-seekers belonging to SC/ST. these includes

- maintenance of their registration cards separately,
- ensuring that the vacancy notifications from public sector establishments invariably indicate details regarding reservation,
- providing vocational guidance and imparting recruitment training,
- sponsoring suitable candidates against unreserved vacancies,
- enlisting the cooperation of SC and ST association in locating suitable candidates.

The year-wise performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of Scheduled Caste job-seekers is given in **Table-10**.

- Over the past 10 year period from 1995 to 2004 Live Register of SC job-seekers has increased from 50.1 lakh in 1995 to 64.7 lakh in 2004, amounting to an increase of 29.1%.
- SC job-seekers were 16.0% of the total job-seekers on the live register at the end of year 2004.
- Registration of SC job-seekers in a year varied between 7.3 to 7.6 lakh during the period 1995 to 2004 except in 1997 when, the registration was 8.2 lakh.

- Placement of SC job-seekers has declined from 29.1 thousand in 1995 to 16.0 thousand in 2004. Percentage of Placement to the Registration of SC job-seekers in the year 2004 was of the order of 2.2% as compared to overall ratio of 2.6% for all categories.

The year-wise performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of educated Scheduled Caste job-seekers is given in Table-11.

- The percentage of educated SC job-seekers to the total SC job-seekers has increased from 58.7% in 1995 to 69.6% in 2004.
- Out of 16.0 thousand placements made of SC job-seekers during 2004, 9.9 thousand were that of educated SC job-seekers. Despite this Live Register of educated job-seekers has increased from 29.9 lakh in 1995 to 45.1 lakh in 2004.

The year-wise performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of Scheduled Tribe job-seekers is given in **Table-12**.

- Live Register of ST Job-seekers has increased form 14.1 lakh in 1995 to 22.2 lakh in 2004.
- Registration of ST job seekers in a year varied between 2.3 lakh and 2.8 lakh during the period 1995-2004. However, the registration was highest (3.5 lakh) during the year 1998.
- ST jobseekers were around 5.5% of the total job seekers on the Live Register at the end of year 2004.
- The placement of job seekers has witnessed decline in general and a similar trend has been observed in case of SC job seekers but increase has been registered in respect of ST job seekers. Placement was around 8.4 thousand during 2003 as well as 2004.
- Live Register of ST job-seekers has increased from 14.1 lakh in 1995 to 22.2 lakh in 2004 registering an increase of 57 percent during the period 1995-2004.

- Placement to Registration ratio of ST jobseekers was around 3.0% as compared to 2.6% for all categories during 2004.

The year-wise performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of educated Scheduled Tribe job seekers is given in **Table-13**.

- The percentage of educated ST job seekers to the total ST job-seeker has increased from 57.8% in 1995 to 63.8% in 2004.
- The total number of educated ST job seekers stood at 14.1 lakh at the end of 2004.
- Out of 8.4 thousand ST placement, around 5.6 thousand were in respect of educated ST.

State-wise performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of SC/ST/OBC job seekers for the year 2004 is given in Table 13-A.

- It may be observed that Tamil Nadu has maximum, SC and OBC (10.7 lakh and 24.2 lakh) job seekers on the Live Register whereas M.P. has maximum (2.9 lakh) Scheduled Tribes job seekers on the Live Register of the Employment Exchanges.
- Gujarat has shown the maximum number of placements in respect of SC (5.1 thousand) and ST (4.4 thousand) while for OBC job seekers maximum placement was (4.2 thousand) in Tamil Nadu.
- Registration during the year 2004 for SC was maximum (1.1 lakh) in Maharashtra, for ST maximum was in Madhya Pradesh (0.33 lakh) and for OBC, maximum was in TamilNadu (1.7 lakh).
- Percentage of placement to Registration was maximum in Gujarat for SC&ST job-seekers and in Chandigarh for OBC Job-seekers.

## **2.6 PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED JOB-SEEKERS**

The Employment Service is making all efforts to cater to the special needs of the physically handicapped job-seekers.

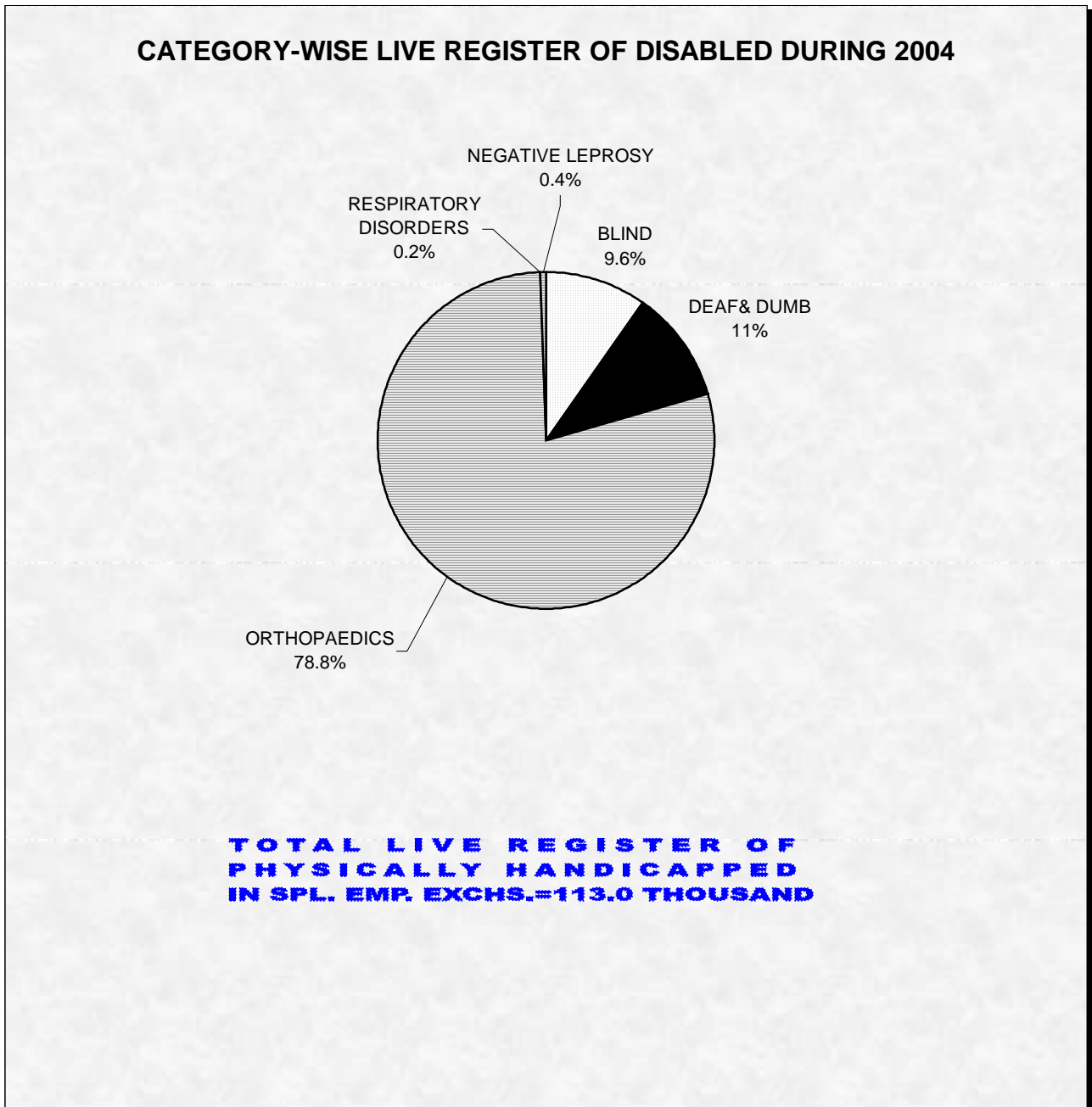
- At all India level there were 43 special employment exchanges working at the end of the year 2004, out of these, exchanges at Chandigarh and Shimla are maintaining duplicate cards only.
- In addition to these special employment exchanges, there were 38 Special Cells for physically handicapped job-seekers in the normal employment exchanges, which were also catering special employment needs of physically handicapped job-seekers.
- Apart from these special cells and exchanges, normal exchanges also register the physically handicapped job-seekers.
- Besides these, there were 20 Vocational Rehabilitation Centers (VRCs) functioning at Mumbai, Hyderabad, Jabalpur, Delhi, Ludhiana, Kanpur, Calcutta, Chennai, Ahmedabad, Trivandrum, Bangalore, Guwahati, Bhubneshwar, Jaipur, Vadodara, Patna Agartala, Una, Sri Nagar and Pondicherry. These Centers are working under the direct administrative control of Directorate General of Employment and Training. These centers evaluate the residual capacity of the handicapped persons, impart them necessary vocational training and guidance and put them into the job or self-employment according to their capability.

**Table-15 to 19** gives the work done by Employment Exchanges and VRCs for the handicapped persons. The number of handicapped job-seeker have increased from 3.5 lakh in 1995 to 5.7 lakh in 2004. The placement through employment exchanges remained stagnant at around 3.0 thousand per year during the period 2000-2004. VRCs had rehabilitated as many as 10.0 thousand persons during 2000 and 10.9 thousand during 2005.

Performance of Employment Exchanges /Special Exchanges in respect of PH job-seekers by category of handicap is given in **Table-16**. Orthopedic handicapped job seekers were maximum on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges at the end of the year 2004. Graphical representation of category-wise Live Register of PH Job-seekers for the year 2004 is given on the Page No. 22.

## 2.7 MIGRANTS AND REPATRIATES

The employment service continued to assist in the resettlement of migrants and repatriates from Myanmar, Sri Lanka and East Pakistan Migrants. **Table-20** shows the performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of migrants job-seekers from East



Pakistan, repatriates from Myanmar and Sri Lanka to India. Over the years Live Register for migrants has shown a declining trend. Live Register of migrant job-seekers has decreased from 8.7 thousand in 2000 to 6.1 thousand in 2004.

## **2.8 MINORITY COMMUNITIES JOB SEEKERS**

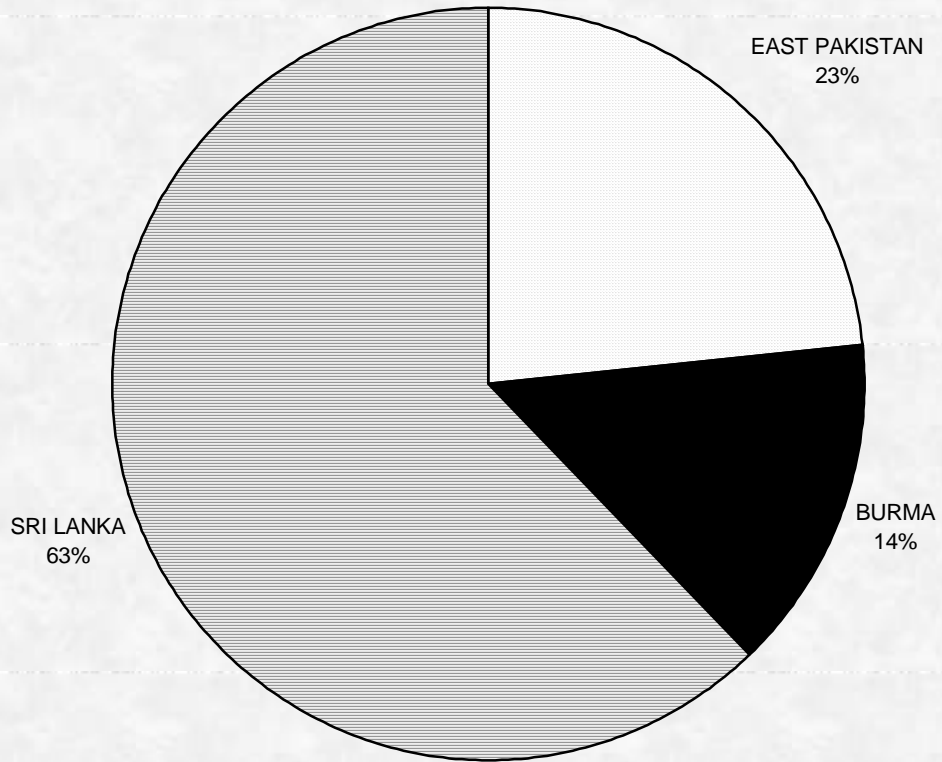
In India, the main minority communities are Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists and Zoroastrians. The statement showing the performance of employment exchanges in respect of Minority Communities is given in Table-21.

- In all there were 60.6 lakh job-seekers on the Live Register of employment exchanges in India, who belong to minority communities at the end of 2004. These account for 14.5% of total job seekers on the Live Register.
- Out of these 35.1 lakh (58.0%) were Muslims, 19.9 lakh (32.8%) were Christians, 3.4 lakh (5.6%) were Sikhs, 2.2 lakh (3.6%) were Buddhist and a very marginal 0.7 thousand were Zoroastrians.
- During the year 2004, 4.7 lakh minority job seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges throughout India. The maximum registration was made in respect of Muslims job-seekers (2.6 lakh) followed by Christians and Sikhs job seekers (1.3 lakh) and (0.5 lakh) respectively.
- The maximum placement was made in respect of Muslims job-seekers (2.8 thousand). The percentage of placement to submission was maximum for Muslims 4.4% followed by Sikhs 0.9% and Christians 2.6%.
- Graphical representation of the live register of a minority community Job-seekers for the year 2004 is given on the page no. 25.

## **2.9 EX-ITI AND FULL TERM APPRENTICES**

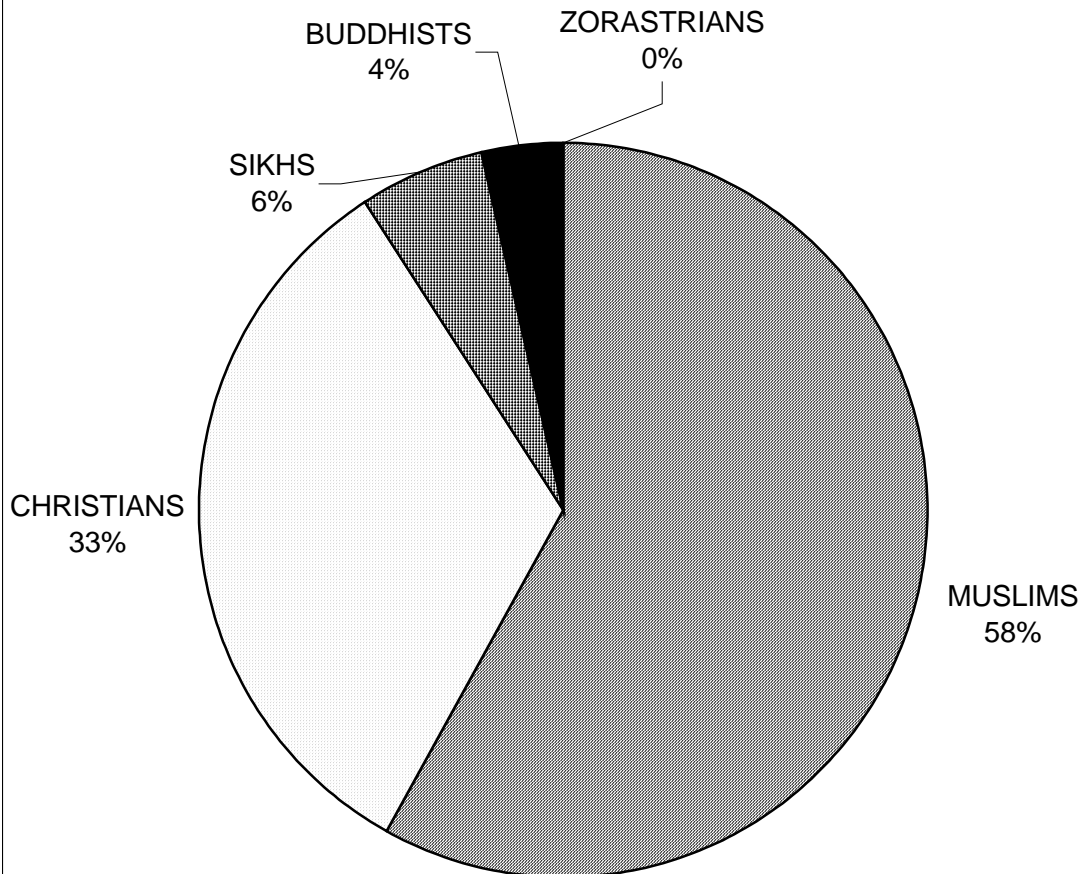
The performance of Employment Exchanges in respect of Ex-ITI and Full Term Apprentices during the period 1995-2004 is given in **Table-22**. The job-seekers who have completed ITI courses and got themselves registered with the Employment

Exchange was 14.9 lakh at the end of the year 2004. The Live Register of Ex-ITI job-seekers has shown an increasing trend over the period 1995-2004. It has increased

from 10.7 lakh in 1995 to 14.9 lakh in 2004. The placement of Ex-ITI job seekers has varied between 4.4 thousand to 14.2 thousand during the period 1995-2004.

The Live Register of job-seekers, who have completed full term apprentice, has also shown an increasing trend. The full term apprentice job seekers have increased from 90.3 thousand in 1995 to 1.7 lakh in 2004. Comparatively, placement position of full term apprentices was better than Ex-ITI's in terms of percentage of placement to live register.

### **3.0 OCCUPATION GROUP-WISE JOB-SEEKERS**

Number of job seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges classified by broad occupational groups at the end of 2004 is given in Table-23. It may be seen that the majority of the job seekers, (72.5%) were in the category of workers not classified by any occupation. Which means that the majority of job-seekers are inexperienced, fresher and do not fall in any category of occupation. Second highest, (10.7%) was in the production & related workers, transport equipment labourers. Minimum number of job seekers, (0.3 lakh) belonged to Administrative executive and managerial workers. In case of women job-seekers, again, maximum (73.5%) job-seekers were in the category of workers not elsewhere classified, followed by 12.1% in the category of Professional, Technical and relates workers. Only around 0.1% women job seekers were in Administrative, Executive and Managerial workers & Sales workers.
